

Pimp My Cart

The Pimp My Cart awards were also broken down into Judges Choice and Peoples choice award categories and the Judges were Molly, Danaira and Jane.

Once again there was a fantastic number of entries and some very imaginative ideas. Part of the evaluation included a short road test on the farmland behind the WoM village square.

A massive well done to Ferri and Rahi who scooped gold in both the Peoples Choice and Judges Choice awards. This is how the creators described their cart:

"A beautiful view of the scenery and being above everyone else is what the Lusty Kitten has to offer. It's crow's nest is equipped with the most comfortable seating space available at such heights. Two comfy cushioned spots are reserved for only the most noble pirates, placing them close to the steering wheel in case one of the pulling ponies is acting up. For such brats, the Lusty Kitten has just the solution: The cage located at the stern of the boat will keep them in check and stop them from

any mischief. And when a pony gets really uppity, the easiest solution is to use it as figurehead. Restraining them for everyone to see just how poorly behaved they are. Alternatively, beautiful eye candy can be used instead.

The hull oft the ship is made out of sturdy, locally 'found' wood and can withstand impacts easily. With it's pirate themed sail and flag, it is perfectly suited to attract stoats. The ship is gently placed on a trailer, which was custom made just for this ship out of the highest quality Krupp-Stahl acquirable. The trailer is pulled by up to three ponies which are secured using sturdy leather straps to ensure proper tightness and not a chance of escape for a pony once it is strapped in place.

This means the Cart can hold up to four passengers and three ponies. Two passengers on the cushioned bench, one in the crows' nest and the lucky caged individual. All three pulling ponies are positioned in front of the cart."

Gazette: Are there any particular highlights or stand out memories from WOM 2022 you want to

Molly: Well as you alluded to, it was a much more ambitious event. Everything we did was bigger and better, and this year I had so much more help which meant I had more opportunity to enjoy it. I was able to take the lead on a few events and let the rest of the events run themselves.

Molly: For a standout event, Pimp My Cart is my baby, and I have greatly enjoyed it both years we have done it. I enjoy the creativity and thought that goes into it.

Molly: In terms of an event that was totally out of my control, the blind carting was very fun, it's probably a bit scary for newbies to do blind carting but it was different in the best kind of way. I want to try it again next year, and maybe trick more people into taking part!

Gazette: Did this year feel like more work than last year?

Molly: Yes and no, the most boring answer of all! I had a lot more help this year. It would take forever to shout out everybody, but for a few stand

Molly: Cookie took a huge pressure off my shoulders. I started WoM prep mostly alone around Feb time, I was able to give Cookie a few simple things I wanted some help preparing and she hit it out of the park. It meant when prep began in earnest the basic building blocks were all ready.

Molly: And all the elves had a part too, but as I said, the list would be unending if I kept going. They can all shout at me after for missing them out Gazette: I remember last year you needed a welldeserved rest afterwards and I hope you have had time for one this year?

Molly: Mostly, but I guess it depends on your definition of rest... A little break from ponyplay in general, but I have been building steeple tracks, planning some things in the background for later in the year...

Gazette: How were the participant and audience numbers compared to last year?

Molly: About equal, but also to be expected. WoM #1 was held at the height of the Covid lockdowns so numbers across SL were much higher for everything.

Gazette: Are there any aspects or events you feel worked particularly well and any others not so well?

Molly: Trophy and medal handling was much better than last year, I think last year I spent a week just handing out trophies and medals, this year, other than the trophy engraving, I was able to just get them out the day after.

Molly: As for challenges? I think RL caught a few of our organisers by surprise and so it caused unneeded stress. I worry that by stepping away to let others organize and plan things, I kind of threw them into the frying pan. I need to work to find a balance of being there to help people, without being overbearing and stealing their project off them.

Gazette: We had an interesting quirk with joint gold winners in a number of events. What are your thoughts on those?

Molly: Plus, we anticipated with it being a Sunday night, not everyone would survive the whole night, so the small slots allowed everyone to have equal spotlight.

Molly: I have no idea; I can only try ^^ Prep starts now!

Molly: no ha... or maybe...depends...the first WoM was put together in 3 weeks, I think? And it was mainly myself, some people hosted the events but the build and organising was just me, it was too much.

Gazette: Interesting... and this year?

Molly: This year? We officially started 3 months prior, myself and Cookie started full time prep two months before, everyone else jumped in to prep with 1 month remaining.

Gazette: I don't think I even asked you this last year, my bad – but can you tell me a bit more about how the idea came together for WOM as an event in general?

Molly: I am not really sure... I think Danna was a big part of it... I wanted an anniversary event. Go big or go home right? ^^

Molly: Pimp My Cart was always the big event it was designed around, but one event does not make it a success.

Gazette: Oh I remember some early conversations where it was suggested that Marine Kelley might be one of the judges.

Molly: Yes, I asked Marine for this year too, but the date did just not work sadly, but she did wish us the best. Fingers crossed for next year though! Ideally, I would prefer to host PMC and not be a judge.

Molly: I don't think so, that felt pretty conclusive
